

Don't forget to bring 3 Fat Quarters for our game. Since school is starting, if you have something related to school bring that. Otherwise, bring what you have.


## Home, Craft and **Garden Fair**

### Minutes from 7 July, 2025

The Quilt Guild Meeting met on 7 July at the Extension Office. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by President Mary Lowery. There were 19 members and 1 guest present. Peggy Franklin read an inspiration.

Officers are Mary Lowery, President; Cheri Meadows, Vice President; Secretary, Betty Jo Moss; and Peggy Franklin, Treasurer. Peggy reported the bank balance is \$1139.63.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Mattie reported on the annual Homemakers meeting held on June 5, 2025. New officers were elected and installed by Fort Harrod President, Leoni Mundelius. They are Kay Scheffler, President and Mary Lowery, Secretary. The Living Legend of the Year Faye Green was recognized. Mary Lowery was recognized as Homemaker of the Year and June Denny was recognized as Quilter of the Year.

Mary reviewed upcoming events as listed on the agenda. KEHA is updating the state bylaws. We will review our bylaws when that is completed. Cheri is preparing a calendar with events so members will know the dates of meetings and events.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

In keeping with the increase of County Dues, Mary suggested increasing Quilt Guild dues. The increase will be \$25 and will include \$13 Quilt Guild and \$12 County dues. Peggianna made the motion to increase the dues to \$25 as explained. Betty Ann made the second. Judy explained how the dues are applied. Motion passed. No dissent. Members played the Left/Right/Center fat quarter game. Winners at each table were Pat S (guest), Kay M, June, and Gail.
