Joan called the meeting to order and welcomed two visitors. Shelly Robinson brought her friend Courtney. Twenty-five people were in attendance. She asked if there was anyone who was not getting the Anderson County Piecemakers Newsletter. A form was sent around to collect missing email addresses.
